



Population Growth



 Since 1970, the Town of Ossining's population increased by 14%, from 4,846 to 5,516.


Population Density

Race & Ethnicity


- In Ossining, there is a correlation between higher population density and greater racial diversity.


 The White population has decreased from 92% to 70% from 1990 to 2018.

Median Household Income

- Briarcliff Manor has the highest Median Household Income (per census block group) within the study area at over \$150,000.
- The median household income in the Town of Ossining is \$101,373 in the western portion of Town, \$114,018 in the central portion of Town, and \$148,125 in the eastern portion of the Town.







Housing Units by Building Type



Unit Distribution




• From 2010 to 2018, median home values in the Town of Ossining decreased by 10%, from 500,000 to 450,000.




Road Network (by type)

- Routes 9 and 9A have drastically different character despite sharing the same roadway class: Route 9A is a high-speed thoroughfare connecting to the Taconic State Parkway, while Route 9 has a more local character.
- Secondary roads provide connections between neighborhoods but are not well suited for pedestrian use.
- Tertiary roadways are car-oriented but also serve pedestrians.




Annual Average Daily Traffic

- Route 9A has an AADT of 33,503 \bullet (2016), while Route 9 has an AADT of 18, 441.
- Croton Ave (NY 133), an important connector between the Town and Village, has an AADT of 8579.



Traffic Incidents

- Route 9A has been identified as a dangerous thruway, with over 100 traffic incidents reported per year.
- There are an average of 4-5 ightarrowaccidents per month at the intersection of N State Road and Route 9A.



Connectivity

The Briarcliff – Peekskill Trailway extends from Ryder Rd north into Cortlandt, where in connects with the Old Croton Aqueduct Trail, which eventually loops through the Village of Ossining. However, there are currently no viable east-west pedestrian connections within the Town of Ossining.




Westchester County Trails

- The Riverwalk, Croton Aqueduct State Trailway, and the Briarcliff-Peekskill Trailway all pass through Ossining.
- The North County Trailway passes along Ossining's eastern border




Sidewalks

Pedestrian Activity (Strava)


Based on strava data, North State Road and Old Albany Post Road are the most heavily trafficked running trails


Major Cultural Institutions - Arts

• The majority of cultural institutions in Ossining are in the Village, clustered on Main St, Croton Ave, and S Highland Ave.





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


Major Cultural Institutions - Schools and Places of Worship



83% of the Town of Ossining is zoned as some form of single-family residential. 7% is zoned as multifamily. The remaining 10% is a mix of commercial zoning classes.






Open Space

Topography + Slope


There is extreme variation in \bullet topography and elevation across the Town of Ossining, ranging from sea level up to 580 feet above sea level.





Flood zones in the Town of Ossining are largely confined to streams and directly adjacent areas






Watersheds

Ossining falls primarily within ulletthe Pocantico and Saw Mill River watershed, although the northwest corner of the Town drains into the Croton River Basin.




Watersheds + Sub-basins

• There are eight sub-basins that span across the Town, Village, and Briarcliff Manor.






• The Caney Brook system is bordered in sections by forested freshwater wetlands.

Emergent freshwater wetlands abut ulletRockhill Pond in Cedar Lane Town Park.









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Inflow and Outflow of Workers and Residents


